## GoAir goes for comfort, launches business class

**New Delhi:** The Wadia Group's **GoAirlines (India) Pvt. Ltd.**, which runs low-fare carrier GoAir, has named its business class 'GoComfort' for corporate travellers, according to its website.

The decision to include a new class of service was part of positioning itself as a value carrier, in between a full-service and no-frills carrier. The new seats, with an 85 cm pitch, will be in the first four

rows without a middle seat.

A selection of complimentary drinks and snacks will be available for GoComfort passengers, who are also free to change their itinerary without extra charges. Full refund will be given in case of cancelling tickets 2 hours prior to departure.

According to information available on the website, a Mumbai-Delhi economy ticket on GoAir for November was priced at Rs750 (excluding taxes and surcharges) while GoComfort costs Rs2,800. Mint had reported this development in two articles dated 5 and 12 October. **P.R. SANJAI**
