GoAir adds one aircraft, two destinations

After establishing its presence in north, west and southern parts of the country, the Wadia Group owned low-fare airline, GoAir, today expanded its network in the North-East by adding two new destinations, Guwahati and Bagdogra. The airline today inducted one brand new A320 aircraft to its existing fleet. The airline will offer an all inclusive starting fare of Rs 2,400 and Rs 2,900 for flights to the new destinations originating from Delhi and Mumbai respectively.

The airline aims at catering a mix of various segments like small and medium enterprises, corporate travellers, leisure fliers and pilgrim traffic on these two newly launched routes. "Realising that there is a lot of unmet demand for corporate and leisure travel in the two cities, the airline has expanded its presence to eastern India," said a company press release. The addition of the two new routes takes the total number of destinations served by GoAir to 13 and total number of weekly flights provided by the airline

to 335. With the induction of a brand new aircraft, the total number of aircraft in its fleet has now risen to 7. The airline plans to induct another aircraft in June this year, thus making the average age of the GoAir fleet approximately 6 months, the release stated. Guwahati is the gateway for all the seven states of North-East and Bagdogra is the gateway for Sikkim, Nepal and Bhutan. GoAir will provide the customers with the ease of flying morning flights from Mumbai to Delhi-Guwahati and Bagdogra.
